# Integrated Leadership Development Program

Hannah Garrett provided an update on our "Integrated Leadership Development Program". A few comments were made regarding the events. Discussion also took place on the new leadership continuum structure that will be implemented in the next few years.

MFE/ALA: No major changes to report

**SLE:** SLE is at 75 participants and will remain a bi-cameral approach.

## **Senior Conference:**

- Senior conference will be piloted this summer 2019
- Planning to work with universities for facilities. (UC Davis & Cal Poly Pomona)
- Dates will be mid to late July

**National Convention –** Participation numbers were highest numbers in past 5 years. The biggest issues discussed include:

#### Statistics:

631 State trip participation

- 169 adults; 462 students; 73 chapters
- 396 regular trips; 235 DC trips
- 623 flights booked through Great Escape/others booked their own separately
- 230 one-way flights to D.C.; 2 one-way flights returning to CA; other guests booked their own (Rosa & Sperling)
- New charter bus company, Excellent Tours. Looking into this for next year as well.
   Drivers can give guided tours instead of State Officers, if we choose to. They seemed very knowledgeable about D.C. and helped the State Officers with historical information.
- New this year, one-way flights. Increased the D.C. trip, but our numbers did not drop drastically. (2017: 250; 2018: 235)
