The Opening Ceremony was conducted by the State FFA Officers and the meeting began with a welcome from Carlyn Marsh, State FFA President.

### **State Advisor Report**

Mr. Parker, State FFA Advisor, gave a brief update on the direction of FFA and the state budget. Highlights included:

- -Regional Supervisor Positions are all filled
- -Staff is more diverse
- -New division director at CDE is very data-driven

#### CATA/Foundation Report

Mr. Patton gave an update that included the following items:

- -Fiscal allocation by Governor Newsom is a record
- -\$4 billion in Prop 98 dollars
- -Foundation is hiring new Development Director
- -Staff changes at the FFA Center will require new hiring

#### **State FFA Executive Committee Minutes**

Kayla Zalesny moved and it was seconded to accept the minutes from the September joint State FFA Executive Committee and State FFA Advisory Committee meeting. Motion passed by a voice vote.

### **Region Update**

The Regional Presidents proceeded to give their individual updates. Each regional president provided a small newsletter with upcoming events and information. Their handouts included information on Fall Regional Meetings, State Degree Scorings, Regional Officer Screenings, and upcoming dates.

### **State FFA Degrees**

David Lopez moved and it was seconded to approve all 2,699 State FFA Degrees forwarded to the committee from State Staff. Motion was approved voice vote.

### **Topics of Consideration**

The State Leadership Conference schedule was handed out, and the schedule changes were discussed.

### Primary change to State FFA Convention Schedule includes:

Moving the program to the Guidebook app and reducing the schedule by a full session in order to get people on the road earlier.

#### **Proposed State Amendments**

Amendment Proposal 2 (State Officer Increase to 8) –

Reagan Dahle moved, and it was seconded that the Executive Committee go on record recommending a DO NOT PASS to the motion to increase the number of State Officers to 8. The motion was debated and passed, voice vote.

Amendment Proposal 1 (State Officer Survey Removal from Constitution) –

Reagan Dahle moved, and it was seconded that the Executive Committee go on record recommending a DO PASS to remove the state officer surveys from the Consitution. Motioned passed voice vote.

### **Program of Work Committee Items**

### **Delegate Committee Topics**

The delegate committee topic list was reviewed and discussed. The executive committee brainstormed possible topics for delegate consideration and the following committee topics were selected.

### **Committee Chair 2.1 – Expansion of Middle School Opportunities**

The purpose of the Committee on Middle School Expansion is to suggest new middle school opportunities in California FFA. These opportunities of involvement include, but are not limited to, Career Development Events and leadership conferences.

### **Committee Chair 2.2 – Expansion of SAE Opportunities**

The purpose of the Committee on the expansion of SAE Opportunities is to assess the current SAE opportunities and suggest new SAE educational recognition opportunities. These opportunities include, but are not limited to, New Proficiency Areas and evaluating State Degree Requirements.

### **Committee Chairs 2.3 – FFA Applications**

The purpose of the Committee is to evaluate the suite of applications that FFA members currently use for assorted conferences and leadership roles and suggest updates that reflect current needs and growing numbers. This includes, but is not limited to, State FFA Office, Nominating Committee, Sacramento Leadership Experience, et.

# **Committee Chair 2.4 – Student Exposure to Agriculture Careers**

The purpose of the Committee on Agriculture Careers is to suggest educational experiences for students to learn about agricultural careers in California. The committee should explore field trip opportunities, online resources, chapter resources kits, etc.

### **Committee Chairs 2.5 - Career Development Events**

Discuss opportunities for the improvement of California FFA's CDEs. Possible discussion items include: new contest regional qualifiers, matching California rules to National contest rules, and additional contests to explore.

#### Committee Chair 2.6 – Student Resources for AET

The purpose of the Committee on Resources for AET is to suggest the type of resources students would find useful in operating AET. These ideas include, but are not limited to resources for chapter management, SAE resources, Application resources, etc.

# **Committee Chairs 2.7 – Expand Local Alumni Engagement**

The purpose of the Committee on Alumni Engagement is to consider how to keep alumni engaged in the local FFA program. The committee will focus on how to engage local supporters with an FFA alumni chapter. The committee will suggest resources, activities, etc. that can engage alumni with a local chapter.

David Lopez moved, and it was seconded to approve the delegate committee list. Motion passed by voice vote.
