This year the California Association, FFA hosted a record-breaking 5,400 freshmen at 31 different Greenhand Leadership Conferences (GLC) that spread from Redding, located in the Superior Region, all the way to Imperial, in the Southern Region. GLC aims to introduce students to the benefits and opportunities in Agricultural Education, including SAE and FFA. GLC is no ordinary leadership experience; conference attendees are granted their "All Access Pass" which allows them to move through sessions and take an active role in learning how Agricultural

Education and FFA can have a positive, meaningful impact on their life. Throughout the day, students learn about the three ring model, the benefits of Agricultural Education, the leadership development continuum (GLC, MFE, ALA, SLE, and WLC), and leave the conference with a personal plan for success. For many, that plan also includes going back to their chapter to enhance their knowledge on FFA and ultimately pursuing their Greenhand Degree.

OUTSTANDING CHAPTER



Resting in the beautiful High Desert Section of the Southern Region, Lucerne Valley is a small scenic town of just under 7,000 people who are spread over 150 square miles. Our high school population is small, hovering around 215 students, but the Agriculture program touches nearly half, at 105 students. Lucerne Valley FFA was chartered in 1994 and since then we have had our one advisor and teacher, a Canadian transplant, Mr. Troy Van Bavel. Locally, we have many small livestock farms and the main crops are

alfalfa and pistachios, with a few other varieties of specialty crops. There are three major mines that hug the surrounding mountains. Lucerne Valley FFA has thrived throughout these years largely due to the administration and community support, and the dedicated hard work of chapter members,

past and present. The continued dedication, loyalty, and support by a variety of people, businesses, and community groups in our little town have played a major role in the success and reputation of our chapter.

Our chapter is smaller in terms of numbers, yet our membership is large within our



total population. Lucerne Valley agriculture department is able to offer the incoming freshmen earth science as a starter class, and then continue with a variety of classes in leadership, agriscience, landscape, and agriculture mechanics. It is in the earth science class where students receive the "eye-opening"

Lucerne Valley's FFA Chapter includes nearly half of the high school's population

unit on FFA, with every student earning their Greenhand degree and starting their SAE projects.

We have developed many traditions over the years. Every year, like other chapters, the Greenhands paint their hands green to develop team spirit and induct these members into a storied and passionate group of young people. We also have administrative and staff support as the day is transformed around the Greenhand recipients. The chapter officers are able to present a leadership workshop during a class period filled with fun, challenging, and leadership focused activities. During the final

period of the day, the entire freshman class is released to the auditorium where they all are presented the Greenhand Degree during an official ceremony. This is a great way to ensure that nobody misses out on the importance of this degree and all that entails being a FFA member. The

second year members are geared to give their "Chapter Degree Presentations"; presentations that are student focused.

FFA Week activities have become a favorite to watch and indulge in as the students really enjoy themselves and the involvement from

staff. All week the classes participate in events that accumulate into a final competition where the entire FFA program is released for a half day to compete. Events include the a-frame, log ski, hay and straw stack, tractor pull, seven-legged race, strong man and woman, egg toss, pepper eating, and team tug-of-war.

The Chapter meetings we host are always huge events with students, staff, and families alike. With a committed officer team, we hold many unique activities to engage all our students. Events can range from capture the flag, to a huge Call of Duty "gamer" tournament. Our chapter has been home to plenty of sectional officers, regional officers, and even a state officer back in 2001.

The members of the Lucerne Valley FFA Chapter are very dedicated to their SAE projects of various levels. Our chapter has a unique relationship with the local mining sites and students therefore are engaged in reclamation projects within the mining sites. Students collect, grow, care, and revegetate the mined areas in the rugged landscape surrounding our beautiful desert location. Students share their knowledge by working

with the elementary school to host "Ag Days." At this event fourth graders come to explore what a day on the school farm consists including of. animals, building a shop project, and planting in the greenhouse. Within the community, we give tractor and hay wagon rides at the town fall festival,

give presentations and support to the local garden club, and provide assistance with family fun shooting days at the Lions Club Shooting Range.

The attitude we hold around here is that "We don't have to be in FFA - We Get To!" \bullet

LICENSE PLATE FUNDS BENEFIT CALIFORNIA ASSOCIATION, FFA

If you're like most of us, anytime you go to a FFA conference, field day, booster event or any other agriculture oriented activity there are a few unifying elements that always stand-out and let you know that you're in the right place. The school vans, boots, blue jackets and now the unifying agriculture license plate. Spotting a CalAgPlate at an FFA event, a livestock show or in any random parking lot is particularly exciting for those FFA members and advisors who can still recall the work that California Association, FFA members put into making the program a reality.

Five years ago at the State FFA Conference former CDFA Secretary A.G. Kawamura announced the CalAgPlate program,

and 2015 marked the first year the FFA received funding for the program. Agriculture themed specialty license plates hit the road in 2013, following a tremendous campaign by California Association, FFA members to secure 7,500 paid license plate pledges. In 2015 the California Association, FFA received just over \$162,000 from the CalAgPlate program.

If you still haven't registered for your CalAgPlate, you can purchase a plate on the DMV website www.dmv.ca.gov

and go to the "Online Services" link and then select "Special Interest Plates".

The program is funded with proceeds generated through the sale and renewal of specialized, agriculture themed license plates through the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). The funding has allowed the FFA to enhance and restore programs that were previously reduced due to budget cuts. The printing and delivery of the CA FFA News is one of many programs that was restored because of CalAgPlate funds.

The funds received so far are just the beginning. As additional plates are registered funding to California Association, FFA will exponentially increase - imagine the possibilities! Show your pride for California Agriculture and register for your CalAgPlate today.
