The 91st National FFA Convention and Expo drew a record 69,944 attendees to Indianapolis. Highlights included a special address by sitting U.S. President, Donald J. Trump, and the election of California's former State President, Luke O'Leary, to the office of National FFA President. FEATURED CHAPTER

Santa Maria JJA

Santa Maria is located along the beautiful central coast and is home to a vast array of agriculture production including strawberries, broccoli, beef cattle, wine grapes and a variety of row-crops. Santa Maria High School (SMHS) has a deep rooted history and a tradition of success.

Beginning in 1931, the Santa Maria FFA Chapter was originally a home for the "farm boy" but today as the demographics and community have changed, the program serves students that are from urban non-farming backgrounds. Although the community is a large scale agriculture community, most of the students in the program live within the city limits and have limited firsthand agriculture knowledge. While this poses some challenges for the agriculture department, the traditions of success and student achievement have not changed or waivered over the 88-year history of the program which includes winning the 2017 NAAE Western Region Secondary Program of the Year. The traditions of the program are evident as four of the eight teachers (Marc DeBernardi, Clemente Ayon, Mark Powell and Amanda Rodriguez) are graduates of the Santa Maria FFA Program, and have chosen to teach at SMHS and to give students the opportunities they once had as Santa Maria FFA members.

Today Santa Maria FFA is the second largest



chapter in California and the third largest in the nation with 949 members. The success of the students is a reflection of the passion and dedication of all eight agriculture teachers within the program. Their approach to Agriculture Education has always been "hands-on" and "learn by doing" in all three circles of the FFA.

There is a great deal of diversity within the community and among the students of Santa Maria FFA. In order to create a program that is successful the department has worked hard to develop a diverse program which allows all students to have numerous opportunities to become involved. One of the ways that students become involved, includes being on one of the 12 different CDE teams. On any given afternoon during the spring you can walk the halls of the agriculture department and find over 75 students preparing and practicing for the upcoming CDE contests. The members

have found great success with ten State Championships and a National Championship Milk Quality and Dairy Products, in the past ten years.

Students in the program also have a diverse array of SAE projects to choose from including many options for work placement in the areas of vegetable, fruit, viticulture and nursery production, agriscience research projects, and livestock entrepreneurships, all of which are important forms of work in the community.

In 2018 the program had more than 50 state degrees which are attributed to the students' work placement and entrepreneurship projects.

Santa Maria FFA has a longstanding tradition of working closely with the community in terms of performing community service hours. While not a requirement, over half of our students have participated in some form of community service while in the agriculture program. The service projects range from working with the Food Bank and Toys-for-Tots to posting flags at

the cemeteries during Memorial Day. Annually, Santa Maria FFA students put in over 1,000 hours of community service with various community organization.

To maintain the traditions of the FFA, Santa Maria FFA has found it to be vital to develop outstanding academic courses and pathways, allow students to have a variety of leadership opportunities throughout the FFA and engage students with countless hand-on learning experiences in the field of agriculture.

Clemente Ayon, and Mark Powell; each month floral students make over 50 arrangements for the Flower of the Month Club; a winning group photo of students at the Cal Poly State FFA Finals; community service flag posting on Memorial Day; each summer 34 students show and auction turkeys at the county fair; students learn through hand-on projects in the greenhouse; and a student in the Agriculture Survey Course works on his electrical board.

SALINAS FFA Alumna Starts Peace Corps Service

Teresita Mendoza, 22, of Salinas, began Peace Corps service in Zambia in September 2018, training as an education volunteer.

"I think there's very little I could do with my life that I'd find more fulfilling than helping others in whatever capacity I can," said Mendoza of her desire to join the Peace Corps. "More than anything, being exposed to different ways of life and beliefs will allow me to be more compassionate and understanding—something the world can always use more of."

Mendoza is the daughter of Jose Mendoza Ramos and Patricia Padilla of Salinas and a graduate of North Salinas High School. She attended University of California, Davis, where she earned a bachelor's degree in communication and Spanish earlier this year. Prior to joining the Peace Corps, she was a mentor with The Opportunity Program at Douglass Middle School in Woodland and an aide with the Spanish immersion program at Marguerite Montgomery Elementary School in Davis.

She also acted as president of the North Salinas Future Farmers of America (FFA) chapter and president of the Monterey Bay Section of FFA.

During the first three months of her service, Mendoza will live with a host family in Zambia to become fully immersed in the country's language and culture. After acquiring the necessary skills to assist her community, Mendoza will be sworn into service and assigned to a community in Zambia, where she will live and work for two years with the local people.

"Professionally, I hope to create a space for my students where mistakes are not seen as inherently negative, especially when an effort is being made," said Mendoza. "The lessons should be student



based, taking into account their learning styles. Personally, I hope to appreciate the opportunity I've been given. I suspect keeping an open mind will be a strong ally during my service."

Mendoza will work in cooperation with the local people and partner organizations on sustainable, community-based development projects that improve the lives of people in Zambia and help Mendoza develop leadership, technical and crosscultural skills that will give her a competitive edge when she returns home. Peace Corps volunteers return from service as global citizens well-positioned for professional opportunities in today's global job market.

Mendoza joins the 873 California residents currently serving in the Peace Corps and more than 30,887 California residents who have served in the Peace Corps since 1961. •
